6. REPORTS OF COMMITTEES / RESOLUTIONS

6.1 Water & Sewer Utility – Deputy Mayor Jason Coady, Chair

Councillor McCabe, on behalf of Deputy Mayor Coady, indicated the Committee's report was included in the weekend package.

6.2 <u>Planning & Heritage</u> – Coun. Greg Rivard, Chair

Councillor Rivard indicated his Committee's report was included in the weekend package. for property located at 68 Brackley Point Road (PID #396713), in order to construct two (2) townhouse dwellings containing a total of 14-units, be rejected.

Councillor Rivard indicated that after the October 29th public meeting, the applicant requested a deferral. A deferral would provide the applicant sufficient time to have an independent traffic study conducted at/near 68 Brackley Point Road. Following discussion, it was moved by Councillor Rivard and seconded by Councillor Duffy to defer the motion. Councillors Doiron, McCabe and Rivard opposed. Councillors Duffy, MacLeod and Ramsay in favour. As the vote was tied, Mayor Brown voted to break the tie; his vote was in favour. Carried 4-3; motion deferred.

Due to a public disturbance from the gallery, Council recessed for approximately three (3) minutes; meeting then reconvened.

An update regarding the possibility of reinstating a traffic unit was requested, Councillor Doiron indicated he would take this back to the Committee for discussion.

It was noted that at the previous Protective and Emergency Services Committee meeting, a community safety initiative was suggested; an update was requested. Councillor Doiron indicated he would take this back to the Committee for further discussion.

6.5 Public Works & Urban Beautification – Coun. Mike Duffy, Chair

6.7 <u>Environment & Sustainability</u> – Coun. Terry MacLeod, Chair

Councillor MacLeod indicated his Committee's report was included in the weekend package. He reported that T3 Transit broke another monthly ridership record; October 2019 - 74,240 passengers (October 2018 - 61,423). He further reported that the City of Charlottetown is lobbying the Province to put 'yield-to-bus' legislation in place; the legislation would mean that a vehicle could not pass a transit bus while pulling out from a curb at a bus stop.

6.8 <u>Strategic Priorities & Intergovernmental Cooperation</u> - Coun. Alanna Jankov Councillor Jankov indicated that her Committee did not meet since the last Council meeting.

6.9 <u>Finance, Audit & Tendering</u> – Coun. Terry Bernard, Chair

Councillor Rivard, on behalf of Councillor Bernard, indicated the Committee's report was included in the weekend package.

Questions related to an original request letter dated July 8, 2019, tangible capital asset policy, HST rebate and capital expenditures were raised. All questions were taken under advisement by the Finance Manager as the Chair of Finance was not present.
